SOAR TO HEALTH AND WELLNESS

SOAR to Health and Wellness is a multi-tiered program that includes standardized, accredited training that builds the capacity of individuals, organizations, and communities to apply a public health approach to address human trafficking. The program is designed for professionals in behavioral health, health care, public health, and social services settings. Developed by federal partners and leading experts, including survivors of trafficking, the SOAR framework uses the latest evidence to build practitioners' skills in identifying and responding to trafficking.









WHY TAKE THIS TRAINING?

Did you know? More than 67% of adult survivors of human trafficking report that they were seen by a health care provider **during** their trafficking experience. This means there were missed opportunities to identify and support survivors during and after their experience.



Since 2017, more than 58,000 people were trained. Three-month follow-up data showed:





further developed skills and knowledge about serving victims of trafficking



developed and enhanced vision, mission, or strategic plan with organization leadership



integrated victim-centered, survivor-informed strategies



improved their programs and practices

BEYOND SOAR ONLINE

SOAR for Individuals:

Up to 3-hour training sessions available virtually and in person; CE/CMEs are available upon request for some trainings. The SOAR to Health and Wellness training is available in Spanish.

SOAR for Organizations:

Intensive 14-hour training and strategic planning sessions followed by personalized coaching for organizational leadership. Delivered in partnership with HEAL Trafficking and CommonSpirit, small leadership teams work collaboratively with peers to develop a protocol to identify and respond to trafficking in their organization. CE/CME credit not provided.

SOAR for Communities:

Intensive 10-hour training and strategic planning sessions followed by personalized coaching for multidisciplinary community stakeholders building a public health response to human trafficking. Equips stakeholders with tools to implement change. Available in English. CE/CME credit not provided.
